Submission and Initial Screening

- 1. Submission: Authors submit their manuscripts manually through the email of the editorial team.
- 2. The editorial team will provide feedback to the authors within 1 week.

Peer Review Process

2. Review Process:

- Double-Blind Review: Both the author and reviewer identities are concealed to ensure impartiality.

 - o Reject: The manuscript is rejected.
- 2. Author Response: Authors are expected to address reviewer comments and revise their manuscript accordingly.

Post-Acceptance Process

- 1. Copyediting: The accepted manuscript undergoes copyediting to improve clarity, consistency, and grammar.
- 2. Proofreading: The manuscript is proofread to identify and correct any typographical errors.

- 3. Layout and Formatting: The manuscript is formatted according to the style guidelines.
- 4. Publication: The final version of the manuscript is published online and in print.
